





Yard Waste Pick-up Days

- Oct. 14th, pick up north of the tracks.
- Oct. 17th, pick up south of the tracks.
- Branches - Max 6" diameter, 6' length
- Use paper bags for organic waste, not plastic bags
- 30 gal paper bags available for purchase at the Lumsden Municipal Office, 10bags for \$10.



Household Hazardous Waste Drop-Off Day

- Oct. 19th, 10am-3pm, Drop @ 200 River St. Public Works Shop
- BRING: flammable liquids, gas, paint thinner, acetone, toxic liquids, auto additives, lubricants, corrosives, rust remover, ammonia, bleach, aerosols, lubricants, glue, brake cleaner, batteries, etc.
- NO: oil, paint, antifreeze, ammo, diesel, sharps, etc.



Greetings from the Lumsden & District Volunteer Fire Department.

If you follow our Facebook page, you may see us mention our "1001 class" and wonder what that means. The 1001 is a reference to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 1001 standard for Fire Fighter Professional Qualifications. NFPA 1001 Lvl 2 is the standard required for application to almost any career department. We are very fortunate in Lumsden to have 7 certified Fire Service Instructors (NFPA 1041). These instructors allow us to develop and deliver an extensive training program to train and certify our firefighters to the 1001 Lvl 2 standard. Our "1001 class" started with the LFD in April of 2024 and they are soon approaching their final testing with the Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency this upcoming month.

We'd like to thank everyone for their support at the Scarecrow Festival BBQ. Money raised at these events aids our department in training and upgrading equipment and gear, all in an effort to make our community safer. Our next fundraiser will be our Awards Banquet on November 15, more details will be coming out later in the month.

Finally, October 5-11 is Fire Prevention Week. Stay tuned to our Facebook page, for tips on how to make your household more fire safe.








